POU - TE TAIAO

Our kaimahi have been working with the eight Iwi of Te Taihu since 2021 to proactively ensure that the three Councils of Te Taihu enact to Te Mana o Te Wai, which prioritises the health and wellbeing of water bodies, then the essential needs of people, followed by other uses. We have requested that Councils uphold Te Mana o te Wai Framework, and that all wai sustains life, we can eat from wai and drink from wai māori and our cultural values and connections are maintained.

PROJECTS THAT ARE UNDERWAY

POU - KUIATANGA

He puni wāhine, Tukutuku Wānanga, taiaha wānanga and Te Reo Kia Rewa planning is all underway and will be held in the coming months. Thank you to those people who have registered.

POU - HE PŪTEA

Our partnership with the Department of Conservation is a milestone, granting us management of the Pelorus Bridge Camping Ground. Led by Sarah, Shannon, and whānau, we embrace our role as Kaitiaki o te Kūpenga a Kuia. Brooke's coffee cart adds a modern touch, exemplifying manaakitanga. Together, we elevate the mana of Ngāti Kuia, paving the way for future opportunities.

POU - TE TAI AO Protecting Te Hoiere

In 2023, Te Rōpū Taiao developed cultural indicators using mātauranga o Ngāti Kuia to actively monitor Te Hoiere. Centred in Te Ao Māori, wānanga were held to identify which tohu Ngāti Kuia whānau use when assessing the health of te taiao.

The next step is to assess as much of Te Hoiere as possible, using our tools to understand the current state of the awa, inform future restoration work and actively monitor the effects of activities on neighbouring land. We have received funding to develop resources and wānanga so that whānau can engage in this kaupapa with us. More next month....
