Our values are key to revitalising Te taiao, Nurturing Connections and Uplifting Whānau



This value extends to the whenua and te ao, fostering respect and interconnectedness. Manaakitanga creates a nurturing and uplifting community where everyone is cared for, contributing to the elevation of mana throughout.

Whanaungatanga 🚺

Whanaungatanga signifies the nurturing and fostering of meaningful relationships grounded in whakapapa. This value emphasises the importance of genuine connections and belonging.

In the span of 25 years, Ngāti Kuia has undergone a profound transformation, realising the vision set across the four pou of He Ngāti Kuiatanga, He Tāngata, He Taiao, and He Pūtea and seeking to reindigenise Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Kuia. Te Reo Ngāti Kuia is heard in homes and communities. Our unique identity is vibrant and deeply rooted, supported by platforms like the e-panui, social media and mātauranga wānanga. Whānau are connected and self-determining, supported by initiatives that have nurtured well-being and empowerment. Our commitment to kaitiakitanga is evident in how we live our everyday lives - we consume less, actively lead restoration and He Taiao is recovering. Our economic strength, founded in our tikanga, is undeniable, facilitated by empowered whanau living and working their best lives, and responsible investments.

50 Years

Over half a century, Ngāti Kuia has evolved into an exemplary model of living Te Ao Māori in the 21st Century, building upon the foundations laid 50 years ago. Ngāti Kuiatanga thrives through an intergenerational cycle of wisdomsharing, where digital platforms seamlessly blend with traditional practices to connect us across time. The whanau network is unbreakable, strengthened by multigenerational mentorship that fuels continuous collective and personal development. Te Taiao flourishes with restored ecosystems, thriving biodiversity, and globally recognised restoration efforts that are models of indigeneity. Our economic landscape is diverse, driven by innovative enterprises, responsible investments, and cooperative ventures.

Living all day, every day as Ngāti Kuia. Whānau well being is established and intergenerational. Te mauri o te Taiao is healthy. Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Kuia operates under Te Ao Māori and is thoroughly supported by the material world.











- Ngati Kuia Today 2024 -

In 2024, Ngāti Kuia celebrates ten years since the enactment of Te Whakatau, our Treaty Settlement. This enabled Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Kuia to form a strong asset base, reconnect to places of significance, grow our protection of te Taiao and provide wānanga and resources to our whānau. It was also the next step in the Crown's colonisation of our Iwi. Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Kuia now has 32 kaimahi based in Wairau, Titiraukawa and Whakatū, serving 5000 registered whānau members. Te Hoiere is the centre of our restoration and whānau enterprise activities and we have strategies for Te Reo Ngāti Kuia, Mātauranga, Hauora and Te Taiao. Te Ao Māori faces politically challenging times with proposals to re-write Te Tiriti o Waitangi, displace Te Reo Māori, and remove progress made in Māori health and education. Ngāti Kuia along with other Iwi and Māori are forming collective responses with the call to protect Te Tiriti as our founding constitution and Te Reo Māori as our indigenous language. This is a time of distraction from our own kaupapa when it is vital that as an Iwi, we thrive in all things that are uniquely Ngāti Kuia.



Te reo me ngā tikanga

Develop and advocate for initiatives promoting the use of te reo Māori and Ngāti Kuia tikanga across education, governance, cultural events, and daily interactions, collaborating with local stakeholders to establish speaking environments and integrate cultural practices, while advocating for their inclusion in official documents and public spaces within Ngāti Kuia territories.

Cultural pride and identity

Organise cultural events and intergenerational knowledge exchange platforms to celebrate Ngāti Kuia heritage, foster pride, strengthen cultural identity, and ensure the transmission of traditional practices and wisdom across generations.

Community and resourcing

Establish comprehensive immersion educational pathways for Ngāti Kuia whānau, encompassing formal and informal educational pathways and learning opportunities, supplemented by resources and support to enhance te reo Māori proficiency through courses, tutoring, and immersion experiences.

Language proficiency and pathways

Establish Ngāti Kuia te reo Māori speaking community hubs, physical and virtual, for gathering, learning, and practicing language and cultural traditions, alongside a repository of Ngāti Kuia resources accessible to all whānau via digital platforms and community centres.

Vision

Our vision is for Ngāti Kuia whānau to feel supported, informed, and empowered to take control of their hauora, ensuring whānau are connected, supported and ultimately thrive. Whānau voice is amplifiued and informs the design and delivery of services and support. Through this approach, whānau will experience improved physical, mental, and spiritual health, greater health literacy, and a reduction in health disparities.

Collective Impact and Collaboration:

- Whānau-Centered Support: Ensure all services are designed with whānau at the center, providing holistic and culturally sensitive care that empowers them to take control of their hauora.
- Cross-Sector Collaboration: Collaborate with health providers, community organisations, and other stakeholders to promote a unified, collective impact that supports the long-term wellbeing of Ngāti Kuia whānau.

Improving Whānau Health Outcomes:

- Health Literacy and Preventative Care: Promote greater health literacy and preventative health practices among whānau, helping them make informed choices and take proactive steps to maintain their wellbeing.
- Reducing Health Disparities: Actively work to reduce health disparities by addressing the unique challenges faced by Ngāti Kuia whānau, ensuring they have equitable access to health services and resources.
- Investment in hauora opportunities that directly impact whānau positively.

- Leverage all data sources (Te Whata, Māori Health Providers, Te Whatu Ora).



Mahere Kāinga Whare Ora o Ngāti Kuia

Whānau housing needs are fully met, and whānau are in secure, healthy, and sustainable homes.



Vision

Supporting Ngāti Kuia whānau into warm, safe, secure, and dry homes, while empowering them with the tools and knowledge to navigate the entire housing continuum—from transitional housing to home ownership.

Creation of Housing Opportunities Across the Continuum:

- Transitional to Affordable Rentals: Develop a range of housing options that address immediate needs for transitional housing and affordable rental accommodations.
- Home Ownership: Provide pathways to homeownership through shared equity models, financial literacy workshops, and targeted advocacy efforts.
- Papakāinga and Communal Living: Develop marae centered papakāinga or communal living environments that reflect Ngāti Kuia values and support intergenerational living (Wairau and Whakatū)

Empowering Whānau with Knowledge and Tools:

- Financial Literacy (Ka Uru Ahupūtea) and Home Ownership Workshops: Equip whānau with financial literacy education, enabling them to make informed decisions about housing options and overcome barriers to home ownership.
- Advocacy and Support: Provide ongoing advocacy to support whānau through the housing process, preparing for rentals and homeownership.

Innovative Solutions to Overcome Housing Barriers:

- Collaborative Models: Ka Uru Ora, Habitat for Humanity and councils to create affordable housing developments on iwi-owned land, utilising innovative approaches to overcome financial and logistical barriers to homeownership.
- Sustainable Housing Solutions: Explore eco-friendly building practices and shared ownership models that align with both Ngāti Kuia values and the needs of whānau.

Data-Driven Housing Strategy:

• Whānau Housing Data: Collect and analyse data on the current state of housing for Ngāti Kuia whānau to inform future developments and initiatives (Te Whata, Kainga Ora, Housing and Urban Development data).

The objective of whānau well-being and opportunities is to create job opportunities and pathways for skill development for Ngāti Kuia whānau. This includes supporting whānau enterprises and fostering an entrepreneurial spirit.
